Aquaculture is the farming of ponds of fish and shellfish. It is becoming more common because of increased production under controlled conditions and cleaner product that is not as likely to contain elevated levels of mercury and other toxic ingredients. Overfishing and chemicals in the natural waterways have reduced commercial fishing opportunities.
